DON BOSCO NAVAJEEVAN CARE HOMES

Inspired by the vision of Don Bosco, the founder of the Salesian Society, Don Bosco Navajeevan was started in 1998 in the twin cities of Hyderabad for the care. protection and rehabilitation of the Young at Risk (YaR). The four centres of Don Bosco Navajeevan serve as homes for the street, poor, orphan and marginalized boys and girls of the society who are picked up from vulnerable and conflicting situations. With the help of the street educators, field staff and the child welfare committee (CWC) of the Government they are rescued and rehabilitated after much counselling alongside providing for all their basic and essential needs.

Since the beginning, DBNJ contacted 32,782 children and among them 13,635 were registered at the centres to receive various services

As many as 7,459 children got home placed and about 3,607 were rehabilitated in **DBNJ Homes.** At present, 60 girls and 140 boys are pursuing formal education and

vocational training in DBNJ.

Major Activities From September to November - 2022

Haircut Service by VI Foundation: September 02, 2022: A team of hairstylists

from VI Foundation offered free hair cut to Don Bosco Navajeevan boys in Ramanthapur. The boys tried different hairstyles to look attractive. The team explained about personal hygiene especially about head baths to keep away dandruff. The children enjoyed head massage after their haircuts. The same foundation provided snacks and other eatables on this occasion.





Centre/Department Heads Meeting: September 03, 2022: Monthly meeting of Department Heads took place on this day to evaluate and plan for the activities being taken up for the welfare of children in DBNJ Homes. Awareness on 'Juvenile Justice Act' was given by Mr. A.M. Rajareddy, Chairperson CWC, Medchal. Executive Director Fr. Thomas Remalla reiterated that 'Children are Our Priority' and that every staff should ensure that children feel happy and secure.

Medical Camp in Balanagar Slum: September 04, 2022: Don Bosco Navajeevan Outreach Services (DB4M) conducted a medical camp at Prashant Nagar, Balanagar in collaboration with Prathima Hospitals, Kukatpally, Basic health check up was conducted along with screening for diabetes, ECG and doctor's consultation. Special thanks to Cattellyst Foundation for their support. About 150 sick and needy persons made use of the opportunity and availed free services during the medical camp.

Ganapathi Puja at Hayathnagar Home: September 04, 2022: DBNJ girls participated in Ganapati Puia held at

Information Colony, Havathnagar under the leadership of Information Colony Welfare Association. Mrs. Sabita Indrareddy who was invited for this occasion interacted with DBNJ girls. The Welfare Association members distributed note books and provided a delicious meal.



International Literacy Day: September 08, 2022: On the occasion of International Literacy Day. Br. Atchuth organized an awareness programme on the importance of being literate to excel in life. He encouraged the boys to read newspapers, magazines and other materials in order to gain knowledge for a bright future. The children appreciated the facilities provided to them by DBNJ with regard to their education. They watched inspirational videos on literacy.

Awareness on Personal Hygiene: September 16, 2022:



A drive of personal cleanliness was carried out at Don Bosco Navajeevan, Ramanthapur. The boys were gathered together for a morning session of

orientation on keeping themselves and the area clean and tidy. Focus on personal cleanliness resulting in good health and better learning was explained through charts and images. The boys spent time in trimming their nails, cleaning of wardrobes, sanitizing their living areas etc and finally taking a good bath.

MSW Students from Kerala Visit DBNJ: September 19, 2022: 58 MSW students and 2 faculty members from Don Bosco College, Kerala visited Don Bosco Navajeevan, Ramanthapur as part of their field visit. Fr. P.Arul Das took them on a tour of the whole campus and gave a general orientation about the impact being achieved through the rehabilitation of street, orphan and marginalized children. They interacted with children, encouraged them to dream big and appreciated the efforts of DBNJ Management and Staff.

Football Coaching at Ramanthapur: September 22, 2022: Don Bosco often reminded the students, "Jump,



run and play but don't sin.' Following the footsteps of our founder, Navajeevan homes ensured sufficient time for play in the daily timetable. A

full-fledged foot ball coaching was started on this day. Fr. Thomas Remalla, the Executive Director inaugurated the training session and wished the Coach, Mr. Vivin and the boys all success. The excitement is boundless and the boys wait eagerly for the arrival of the coach everyday.

Medical Camp in Ramanthapur Slum: September 25, 2022: Don Bosco Navajeevan, Hyderabad conducted a medical camp on this day in collaboration with Cattellyst Foundation under the banner "Cattellyst-Don Bosco Navajeevan Migrant Project, Hyderabad" for the most



deserving group of people of a slum on the bunds of Ramanthapur Lake. They are workers involved in garbage collection and segregation, septic tanker

drivers and cleaners, watchmen and watchwomen of apartments, domestic helps, auto drivers and other lower income workers. Thanks to Prathima Group of Super Specialty Hospitals, Kacheguda for collaborating with DBNJ to make this medical camp a success and useful to 150 beneficiaries. Diabetic screening, BP, ECG, 2D Echo tests were carried out besides Cardiologist and General Physician consultations. Necessary medicines were also distributed on this occasion. Kudos to slum leaders and DBNJ migrant team for their concerted efforts in making this event a blessing for the needy!

Extra Curricular Activities at Nampally Home: October 01-09, 2022: During Dusserha holidays the kids at

Nampally had a week long extracurricular activities. The children learnt paper cutting skills, flower making, knitting friendship bands, and chart



preparations on various themes like water, earth, environment etc. Sr. Anupama taught the children with great patience.

Gandhi Jayanthi: October 02, 2022: The 'aftercare



home' youngsters paid homage to Mahatma Gandhi by garlanding his statue erected in Don Bosco Navajeevan, New Bhoiguda premises. Fr. Koshy addressed

the boys on this occasion and encouraged them to control their temper, anger and walk in his footsteps. He recalled also the great determination that Mahatma Gandhi had in achieving freedom from foreign rule.

International Day of the Girl Child: October 11, 2022: Don Bosco

Navajeevan Migrant Desk conducted an awareness rally in 3 migrant locations - Ramanthapur, Malkajgiri and Balanagar. The placards were displayed depicting

the beauty and importance of girl child. conducted in each location and health care is brought to their door steps. He spent time in interacting with parents, children, youth and the elders of the slum communities to learn about the strengths and challenges of the communities and suggest to the team the way forward.

Visit of Friends from Overseas: Friends from Manos Unidas (October 23, 2022) and Don Bosco Jugendhilfe-Weltweit, Switzer-land (November 01, 2022) visited Don

Bosco Prem Seva Sadan Girls Home, Hayath nagar and spent their valuable time with children and the staff. They appreciated the dance performances by the girls and

Case Study

Kamakshi: The most unfortunate Girl



Kamakshi (name changed) does not know how her dad looks as he died when this girl was very small. Later her mother married another man who was a drunkard. The family was living on the pavements along the highway in a makeshift shelter.

The step father too died in 2020 allegedly strangled to death by his friends when they were all drinking alcohol together. Just two days after his death, the mother took her to wash clothes in a lake nearby. A few

moments later, her mother went deep into the lake, drowned herself and died. Horrified, the girl ran with tremors and shivering to her grandfather to inform about the incident. The police were informed and the grandfather disowned her saying he could not look after her. The girl was brought to CWC and further to DBPSS. Right now she is studying in 6th class. The trauma still haunts her. She gets easily upset with other children and gets into a quarrel with them. DBPSS is making every effort to counsel her and accept the loss she had. She says she has an elder brother, younger brother and a younger sister. Right now she does not know where they are. She is happy to study for a secured future.

Success Story

Michael Sandeep-An Example of Hard Work and Dedication

Michael Sandeep who lost his parents at a very young age joined Don Bosco Navajeevan in the year 2012, accompanied by his elder sister and JMJ Sisters from Manoharabad. His two elder sisters were also looked after by the JMJ Convent Sisters as they have no one to look after them. Michael realized that hard work alone would bring him name and satisfaction. He won over the hearts of the management by his disciplined behaviour and keen interest in studies. DBNJ carefully counseled him so as to bring out his full potential. He considered DBNJ to be his home and family and faced every challenge with self determination and intent focus.

Michael has successfully completed his Class X in the Govt. High School, Ramanthapur. He then reached New Bhoiguda Center for his further studies where he completed his 2 years of Intermediate in RLD Govt. Junior College. And then, he started his graduation in Aurora Degree College at RTC Cross Roads and successfully came out with flying colours as a merit student.

As he was pursuing his studies, he also searched for ways and means of earning for his expenses and so he worked part time in many places - Call Centers, Gift Shops, Subway, Pizza and Burger Restaurants etc. Having the desire to learn new things, he chose a short term electrical course organized in DBHRDC,



Gagillapur and worked as an apprentice in Schneider Electronics, Hyderabad during Corona time, for a year. He completed a three month course in digital marketing and after attending many interviews, he was selected to be a trainee at US IT Recruiter in SPARITY IT Company with a good package.

All his difficulties were overshadowed with the generous support of the donors and well wishers of Don Bosco Navajeevan, Hyderabad. He is ever thankful to every donor who contributed for his growth and well being.
